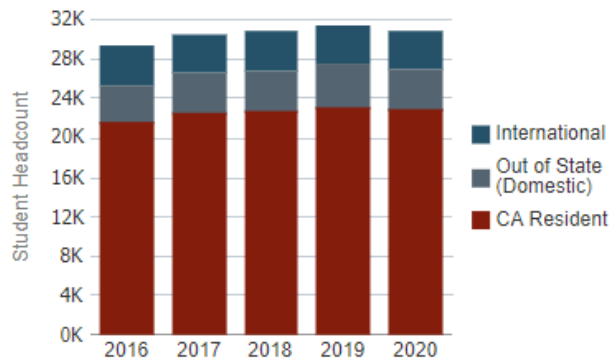

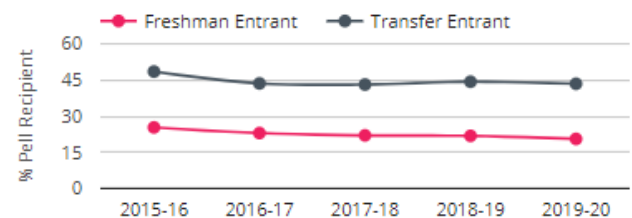

Pell Grant Recipients

Federal Pell Grants provide need-based aid to students from families with annual incomes typically below \$60,000, and are commonly used as a proxy for identifying low-income students. At UC Berkeley, 3,283 students who entered as transfers, and 5,662 who entered as freshmen, received a Pell Grant in the 2019-20 financial aid year. This accounts for 43% of all undergraduates who entered as transfer entrants and 21% of all freshman entrants, as shown below.

First Generation Students

According to applicant data for Fall 2020 matriculated students, 45% of new transfer students indicated that neither of their parents has a 4-year college degree, compared to 28% of new freshman entrants.
